Course Descriptions for Special Topics courses

ACC 491 *Readings & Research in Accounting:*

Forensic/Fraud

This course is a survey of various financial criminal activities ranging from identity theft, embezzlement, tax fraud, credit card fraud, and other emerging areas of financial fraud. Students will work individually and in teams to research and present written and oral case studies that will identify fraud and legal enforcement issues. The course is open to accounting, business, criminal justice and other majors.

Prerequisite: senior standing.

CRJ 492 *Contemporary Issues in Crime & Justice:*

Sr Sem (WI) Miscarriages of Justice

This course is a writing-intensive course that focuses on criminal justice issues of concern to faculty and students. This year's seminar examines the causes and consequences of wrongful conviction of innocent individuals within the American criminal justice system. The course focuses on three broad topics: 1) the flaws and mistakes that can lead to wrongful conviction of innocent people; 2) the mechanisms by which these mistakes are brought to light and remedies that can reduce their occurrences; and 3) the consequences of a wrongful conviction for the innocent individuals affected. Prerequisites: GEN 112 Persuasive Writing and senior standing.
