

## Steps to apply for financial aid at Lakeland College

- 1 Apply for Admission to Lakeland College.**
- 2 Complete the Financial Aid Estimator.**  
Go to [Lakeland.edu/estimateaid](http://Lakeland.edu/estimateaid) (Optional: October 1 to January 1).
- 3 Complete the Lakeland College Financial Aid Application.** Go to [Lakeland.edu/aidap](http://Lakeland.edu/aidap)
- 4 Complete the 2011-2012 Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).**  
The FAFSA can be completed online at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov). You are encouraged to complete the FAFSA online; however, a paper FAFSA can be obtained by calling 800.433.3243. Lakeland College's priority filing date is March 31, 2011. Lakeland College's school code (003854) must be listed on the FAFSA for the college to receive the results from the federal processor. All financial aid eligibility for Federal, State, and Institutional funds is determined by the results of the FAFSA.
- 5 Approximately two weeks after you are accepted to Lakeland** and have completed all financial aid requirements, you will receive an award letter indicating all financial aid eligibility.



*Important dates to remember*

- ✓ **October 1 to January 1:** Complete an estimator form.
- ✓ **After January 1:** Complete and submit the 2011-2012 FAFSA at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov). Complete Lakeland College's Financial Aid application.
- ✓ **After February 15:** When your financial aid is completed, your award will be mailed to your home.
- ✓ **March 31, 2011:** Lakeland's priority filing date.



### Special Circumstances

If you and/or your parent(s) have unusual circumstances which could affect your ability to contribute to college expenses, you may qualify for a re-evaluation of financial aid eligibility. Unusual circumstances include, but are not limited to the following:

- Death in the family
- Retirement of a wage earner
- Loss of a job
- Medical expenses paid and not covered by insurance
- Separation/Divorce

A special circumstance form can be obtained from the Financial Aid Office or online at [www.lakeland.edu/finaid/forms.asp](http://www.lakeland.edu/finaid/forms.asp). You will receive a written response to your request when the re-analysis is complete. The decision of the Financial Aid Office is final and cannot be appealed to the U.S. Department of Education.

**Average Financial Aid Award for Fall 2009 Freshman Domestic Resident Students**

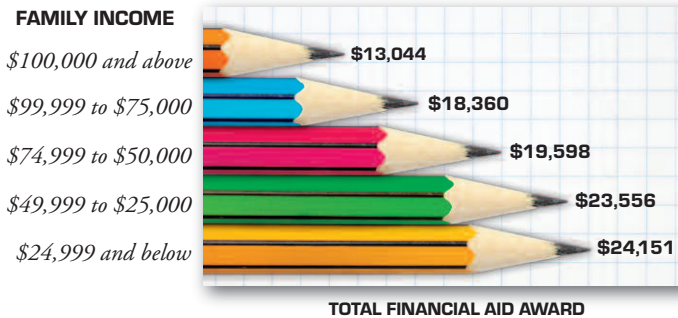


Chart shows the average awards made to the fall 2009 entering class, based on family income. The average award includes scholarships, grants, loans and campus employment.

**Available Scholarships**

- Trustee Scholarship** \$10,000 per year, renewable. Requires a 3.5 Lakeland College GPA to maintain. Available to incoming freshmen only.
- Presidential Scholarship** \$7,500 per year, renewable. Requires a 3.25 Lakeland College GPA to maintain.
- Dean's Scholarship** \$6,500 per year, renewable. Requires a 3.2 Lakeland College GPA to maintain.
- Faculty Scholarship** \$5,500/\$4,500 per year, renewable. Requires a 3.0 Lakeland College GPA to maintain.
- Merit Scholarship** \$6,500/\$5,500 per year, renewable. Requires a 3.2/3.0 Lakeland College GPA to maintain.
- J. Garland Schilcutt Scholarship** Awards full tuition to a qualified Business major. Requirements include a 3.0 high school GPA, a score of 24 or better on the ACT/1680 or better on the SAT, and special application. \* ^

Note: A student may receive only one of the above scholarships.

- The Melvin & Ellen Wagner Scholarship** \$1,000 to \$2,000. Granted to qualified accounting students. Selected students will be invited to campus to meet with Accounting faculty.\* ^
- The Lakeland College Art Scholarship** \$2,000 per year, renewable. Granted to qualified art majors. A portfolio is required for review.\*
- The UCC Pastoral Scholarship** \$1,500. Available for members of United Church of Christ congregations.\*

- Lakeland College Alumni Scholarship** \$1,000, renewable. Awarded upon receipt of alumni referral form.\* Application deadline is February 15, 2011.
- The Helen Boatwright Music Scholarship** \$2,000 per year, renewable. Granted to students interested in music. An on-campus audition is required, and students must participate in a band or choral group at Lakeland.\* +
- András Viski Piano Scholarship** \$2,000 per year, renewable. Renewal based upon fulfillment of specific criteria as set forth by Lakeland piano faculty.\* +
- Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship** \$2,000 per year, renewable. Available for transfer students who are members of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. Requires a 3.0 Lakeland College GPA to maintain.
- CAPP Scholarship** \$300 per year for each Lakeland College CAPP course completed, renewable. Requires a 3.0 Lakeland College GPA to maintain.

\* An application is required and can be requested from the Admissions Office.  
^ Application due by February 1, 2011. + Students will not be awarded more than one music scholarship

**Grants and Loans**

**Lakeland College** In order to help families manage the cost of a continued education, Lakeland College provides its own need-based grant program.

**State Aid** Available to qualified students. Sources of state aid include:

- WISCONSIN TUITION GRANT (WSTG)** (\$1,000 to \$2,900)
- TALENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM (TIP)** (\$800 to \$1,800)

**Federal Aid** Available to qualified students and their families. Sources of federal aid include:

- PELL GRANT** (\$185 to \$5,550)
- SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT (SEOG)** (\$200 to \$2,000)
- FEDERAL WORK STUDY** (\$2,500)
- STAFFORD LOAN PROGRAM (SUBSIDIZED AND UNSUBSIDIZED)** (\$250 to Variable)
- PERKINS LOAN** (\$200 to \$4,000)
- PLUS LOAN** (Variable)

- Quick Facts** Worksheet is optional. It should be completed by the student.
- 100% of students who apply for financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the Day Program receive aid.
- Lakeland College is the lowest-cost private college in Wisconsin. (optional) (C)
- A 12-month interest-free payment plan option is available.
- An outside scholarship does not reduce the amount of gift aid a student receives from Lakeland College. (optional) (C)
- If you are neither a citizen nor an eligible non-citizen, you may still receive aid. However, you should still answer "Neither citizen nor eligible non-citizen."
