## Registration for Spring Semester 2011

Registration is around the corner! We will begin registering accepted transfer students on Thursday, November 4, 2010. Registration will continue through January. Classes begin Wednesday, January 12, 2011. The earlier you register, the more options you'll have regarding your spring schedule.

Your registration will include a meeting with the financial aid office, any necessary placement tests and the selection of your spring courses with your transfer counselor.

To set a registration date that is convenient for you, please call either Ben or Rhett at the phone numbers listed on the back.

## Placement Tests? Do I have to take any?

Maybe, maybe not. Each person's file is evaluated by the Office of the Registrar, and this evaluation determines whether or not placement testing is necessary. Many of our transfer students are not required to take any tests. The three tests which you may need to take are writing placement, math placement, and reading placement. Your ACT scores and high school and/or college transcripts provide us with the information we need to determine your individual testing requirements. Ben or Rhett will fill you in on your requirements when you schedule your registration appointment.

## Financial Aid - How do I get it?

We encourage ALL students to apply for financial aid as soon as possible. There are two applications. One is a one-page Lakeland College application. You probably have a copy sitting in your paperwork from Lakeland, but if not, you can also get it from the Lakeland website. Go to [www.lakeland.edu/finaidapp](http://www.lakeland.edu/finaidapp) and then click on Lakeland College Financial Aid.

The second application is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, known as the FAFSA. Apply online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Lakeland College's FAFSA Code is 003854.

If you are transferring to Lakeland with a strong cumulative GPA, you may be receiving an academic scholarship. The tables below reflect the yearly scholarship amounts awarded based upon your cumulative GPA. There is no need for an additional application—just apply for financial aid as directed on our website.

## Transfer, Adult and Readmit Student Orientation

A brief, yet highly informative new student Orientation will be held Monday, January 10, 2011 in the Laun Center from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. All new transfer and adult students should attend.
