# COACH PETER ROGERS

Head Coach Pete Rogers begins his sixth season as head coach of Lakeland's wrestling program.

Rogers, a native of Oostburg, has taken the same tireless work ethic he used during his own successful wrestling career at Ohio State University to build the Muskies' wrestling program. "I don't like to lose. I'm willing to work hard and put in extra time to build a winning program, and I won't be happy until I do."

The addition of Rogers' presence on the staff allows Lakeland's wrestlers to learn under one of Wisconsin's most accomplished high school wrestlers.

Rogers finished his Oostburg High career with an incredible 145-1 record and three state championships. His only loss came in the state championship match of his freshman season.

He continued his winning ways during a solid career at Ohio State, finishing with an 80-63 record, including a 20-4 campaign his senior season when he advanced to the NCAA Championships and earned a third-place finish in Boston.

Rogers was voted OSU's Most Dedicated Wrestler and a team captain for the 1999-2000 season and Most Pins in 1998-99.

Prior to Lakeland Rogers worked as an assistant wrestling coach at UW-Oshkosh. He has a bachelor's from OSU in sport and leisure studies. Rogers also has teacher certification from Lakeland.

An avid hunter and fisherman, Rogers is enrolled in Lakeland's master of education program, allowing him to realize several of his goals at once.

He resides in Cedar Grove with his wife, Brandi, and one-year old daughter, Isabella Grace and another child on the way.

The Dayton, Ohio, native was 138-28 while in high school and continued his success on the mat in college. He was a member of the 2001-2002 NJCAA Team National Champions at Iowa Central and was a national junior college All-American.

Sommer also wrestled at Ohio State University earning a varsity letter. In addition, he was a team leader in four statistical categories.

Sommer earned an associate's degree in general studies at Iowa Central and graduated with a bachelor's in sociology from OSU in 2006. He resides on campus, and is working towards his master of business administration.

# NATE MUCKERHEIDE

Assistant Coach

Nate Muckerheide enters his second season as an assistant coach at Lakeland.



Muckerheide, an Oostburg native, began his wrestling career has a three-time state finalist. He was crowned state champion in 1999, finished fifth in 2000 and made the podium with a third-place standing in 2001. He finished his high school career with a 126-12 record.

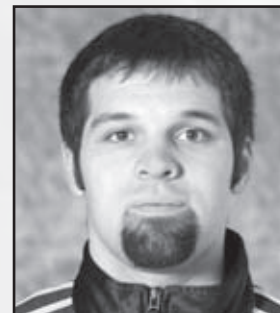
In his collegiate career, Muckerheide wrestled for UW-Oshkosh where he finished with a record of 67-14. He was three-time college wrestler of the week and three-time national alternate.

Muckerheide resides in Oostburg and is completing his degree in fitness studies at Lakeland.

# TIM VALLIER

Assistant Coach

Tim Vallier begins his second season of coaching with the Muskies.



Vallier, a Gladstone, Mich., native, enjoyed a prolific career as a Lakeland wrestler. The Muskies' standout was a four-year captain and finished his career with a 61-56 record. He was a Lake Michigan Conference Championship runner-up.

In high school, Vallier made the record books, becoming just the second-ever father-son state champions in hometown history.

Vallier completed his bachelor's degree in psychology and writing at Lakeland in 2007. He resides on campus as a hall director for Muehlmeier Hall.



With a strong recruiting class of 12 wrestlers and three returning regional place winners, the Lakeland College wrestling team has high expectations for this season.

“Our goal is to do something nationally this year, and we have guys who should be able to get it done,” said head coach Pete Rogers.

Among those expected to have successful seasons are senior Paul Hartt (Port Charlotte, Fla./Charlotte) and junior David Copp (Oostburg/Oostburg).

Hartt had a phenomenal junior year, winning the Northern Wrestling Association 184-pound division title match, 12-0. The co-captain also finished fourth at regionals and led the Muskies in just about every statistical category, including takedowns (76), wins (33) and win percentage (.846). He was named conference Wrestler of the Year.

Copp took the NWA 125-pound title with by a 7-2 victory in the final. He also competed in the regional championships, finishing fourth. The junior compiled a solid 24-12 record in 2006-07, and was second on the team in total points (120) and takedowns (70).

“The sky is the limit for Paul and David,” said Rogers. “They both have the potential to do a lot. They both went on a national team to Turkey and Bulgaria this summer, and worked extremely hard in the off-season.”

The Muskies also welcome back a number of other familiar faces. Junior Kory Theil (Crystal Lake, Ill./Cary-Grove) snagged the conference title at 141 as the No. 2 seed last season, finishing with an improved 18-16 overall record. Junior Jonas Flok (Egg Harbor/Sevastopol) will also be in the mix at 157. Sophomore Adam Sutter (Escanaba, Mich./Escanaba) finished with an impressive 15-4 overall record, and was second in the conference meet at 285.

“Adam has so much talent that I really think he can do some damage,” Rogers said.

Senior Matt Benson (Random Lake/Random Lake) returns to the Muskies after serving time with the National Guard in Iraq last season. In 2005-06, he finished with an even 10-10 record. He will be competing for the heavyweight spot on the team with Sutter.

Sophomore Jake Frias (Oak Lawn, Ill./H.L. Richards) is expected to be another strong contender for the Muskies in the 141/157 division. Last season, he took second place as the No. 3 seed in the conference tournament at 149.

“He had a great freshman year,” Rogers said. “He has done the right things in off season. He put on some weight and put on some muscle. I expect him to do really well.”

Senior Calvin O’neal (Pontiac, Mich./Pontiac Central) also returns to the Muskies’ line-up at 174 after a solid 7-2 showing in 2006-07.

“I expect a lot of things out of him because he’s done the right things during the summer,” Rogers said.

The Muskies’ recruiting class, 12 strong, will fill-in the rest of the holes. One of those expected to make an impact is Ben Chapman (Plymouth/Plymouth), a junior transfer from UW-Madison at 149. At 141, Tyge Benson (Iron River, Mich./West Iron County) is also poised for a solid start as he is a two-time Upper Peninsula State Champion. The Muskies also have a number of Wisconsin state meet place winners, including Jake Montie (Oconto Falls/ Oconto Falls) at 141, who is a two-time state place winner, and Gary Pieper (Adell/Random Lake) at 184/197. Sophomore Tom Mann (Two Rivers/Kiel) is also a welcome addition at 184 after attending UW-Manitowoc and Lakeshore Technical College. He was second and third at state in high school and was a 2002 junior national all-American.

“There are a lot of guys on our team that have the potential to do well in the conference, but also have the potential to do well at the next level,” Rogers said.

The Muskies will have to make it through a tough regular season schedule, and the challenge starts right from the beginning at their own Lakeland Duals, and will continue with competition from several teams in Wisconsin’s state league.

“We’re wrestling some ranked teams at our Lakeland Duals, the first match of the year,” Rogers said. “It should be a good test to tell us where we are at. I think we’ll be able to compete with them and do pretty well. We also wrestle a lot of nationally-ranked teams, including UW-Stevens Point, St. Johns, UW-Eau Claire and UW-Oshkosh.

“We may not end up with the greatest dual meet record, but if we have a decent one, we will be a high-ranked team because we wrestle so many ranked schools..”

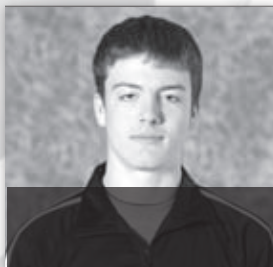
**J**.D. returns to Lakeland's roster this season after missing most of last season due to illness. He will look to improve his skills and earn more time on the mat this season.

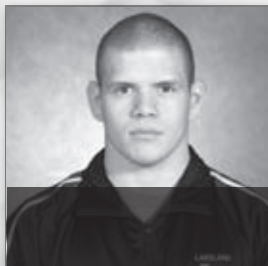

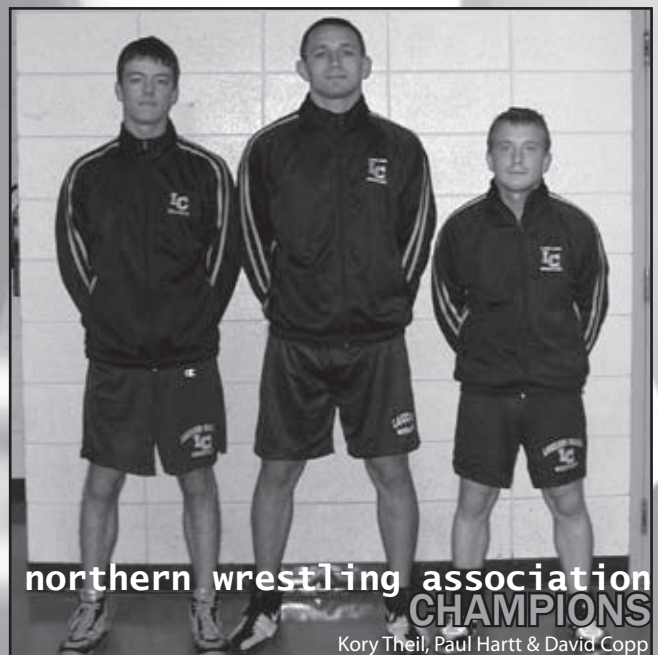
