



TOEFL Exemption for Admissions to Lakeland College

Undergraduate Applicants

- International students must demonstrate proficiency in English as one of the admissions requirements for undergraduate admission. Submission of a minimum score of **500** (**173** CBT- computer-based score, or **61** iBT-Internet-based score) on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is required for all applicants whose native language is not English.
- **Exempt from submitting TOEFL scores are applicants**
 1. who have earned a high school diploma from a high school in the English educational system in any English speaking countries/regions,
 2. who have successfully completed a minimum of one term of full time post-secondary academic studies in the United States, Canada, UK, Australia, or New Zealand at an institution where English proficiency is required for admission,
 3. who have acceptable GCE Ordinary Level or Advanced Level results, GCSE results or acceptable test results of Senior Secondary Certificate Examinations (SSCE) by the West African Examinations Council,
 4. who are recommended by the Lakeland College approved ESL schools in the U.S. or by other institutions of higher learning with which Lakeland College has a signed agreement regarding this requirement, or
 5. who have acceptable IELTS scores (minimum 6 for undergraduate or 7 for graduate admissions)
- The TOEFL score is not required but recommended for admission to the College's English Language Institute (ELI). Students currently enrolled in the college's ELI program must meet the Exit Criteria to begin their academic studies at Lakeland College.

Lakeland College reserves the right to determine whether or not an admission test is required of an international applicant.
