

## Linking to JSTOR Content

1. Once you locate an article in JSTOR, click on *Article PDF*.

2. When the article opens, copy the Stable URL from the address bar.

3. You will need to take the URL you just copied and modify it to include information about Lakeland's system for password authentication (EZproxy system).

EZproxy URL(the same for each article) + article URL (changes with each article) = linking URL

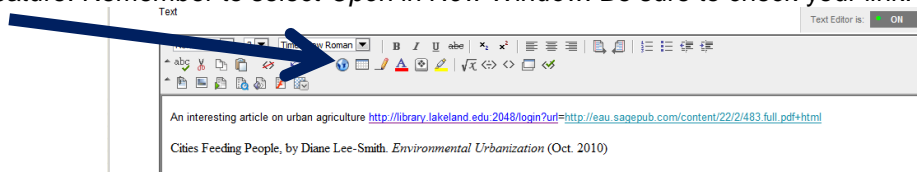

4. Go to Blackboard. Access your course. Under *Build Content*, select *Web Link* and paste the newly created URL. Under options, be sure to check *Open in New Window*.
5. Although adding a link as described in #4 is the recommended method, links can be added into text by using the hyperlink feature. Remember to select *Open in New Window*. Be sure to check your link.
