

Determining Balance Due

The business office is responsible for billing tuition, room and board and will mail preliminary bills during the summer for all registered students. We realize the importance of calculating an expected balance due prior to receiving a preliminary bill. We have provided the costs for tuition and the room and board options below in addition to a guide to calculate your expected balance due. While the business office will bill by semester, we recommend calculating the balance due for the entire year. If you choose to borrow additional loans to pay your balance due, we recommend you apply for the amount needed for the entire year.

Financial Aid Budget

While Lakeland College will only bill students for the direct costs of tuition, room and board (resident students), it is important for students to consider all costs they may encounter while attending college. Below you will see a breakdown of a typical fulltime traditional day student's college budget for an academic year that is made up of direct (billable) and indirect (non-billable) costs. An individual student's financial aid budget will vary depending on whether a student resides on or off campus. Your personal financial aid budget can be found on NetPartner under the 'Awards' tab.

The indirect costs include *Books & Supplies*, *Miscellaneous*, *Transportation*, *Room & Board* (commuter students) and *Loan Fees*. Miscellaneous costs might include any other things you need to purchase for daily living while in college—personal care items, clothing, laundry supplies, etc. Transportation costs can include any costs associated with traveling to and from college—gas, auto insurance, maintenance, etc. The amounts listed for each of these categories are estimated and the actual amounts that students spend for each of these categories can vary greatly from student to student.
