GRANTS & LOANS

Institutional Grants

Lakeland College awards need-based institutional grant funding to help families manage the cost of continued education. Determination of Lakeland Grant funds is based upon the results of the FAFSA and the student's application for admission.

Wisconsin State Aid

Qualified Wisconsin residents may be eligible for state aid, including:

- Wisconsin Grant
- TIP Grant
- Indian Student Assistance Grant

Federal Aid

Determination of federal aid is based upon the results of the FAFSA. Sources of federal aid include:

- Pell Grant
- Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (SEOG)
- Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans
- Perkins Loan
- PLUS Loan (Parent Loan)
- Federal Work Study Not a grant or loan. Funds must be earned by working a part-time campus position. Funds are paid directly to students based on hourly earned wages via a monthly paycheck.

SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

- -Death in the family
- -Retirement of a wage earner
- -Loss of a job
- -Medical expenses paid and not covered by insurance
- -Separation or divorce






Textbooks are considered an out-of-pocket expense and may be purchased or rented from the campus bookstore. The approximate cost for books is \$900-\$1,100 per year.

You can count on the continuation of both your Lakeland College academic scholarships and Lakeland College need-based grant funding, unless your on/off-campus or full/part-time student status changes.*

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS Awarded upon acceptance

FRESHMAN ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic scholarships for entering freshmen will be awarded based on combinations of student ACT or SAT test scores and cumulative, non-weighted high school GPAs. Scholarships range in total value from \$12,000-\$48,000 over four years. Annual awards range from \$3,000-\$12,000, and are renewable with designated Lakeland College GPAs. Students may use the scholarship calculator at Lakeland.edu/Scholarships to determine their scholarship eligibility.

Presidential - \$48,000 over four years. Awarded at \$12,000 and renewable with a 3.0 GPA.

Dean's – \$36,000 over four years. Awarded at \$9,000 and renewable with a 3.0 GPA.

Achievement – \$28,000 over four years. Awarded at \$7,000 and renewable with a 2.5 GPA.

Success – \$20,000 over four years. Awarded at \$5,000 and renewable with a 2.0 GPA.

Merit – \$12,000 over four years. Awarded at \$3,000 and renewable with a 2.0 GPA.

TRANSFER STUDENT ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

PTK Scholarship \$12,000 Annual award to transfer students who are members of Phi Theta Kappa (a junior college honor society). Awarded in lieu of the transfer academic scholarships listed below. Renewable with a 3.0 LC GPA.

Students who have attended previous colleges or universities may be eligible for an academic scholarship based upon their combined cumulative GPA as follows:

J. Garland Schilcutt Scholarship Awards a full tuition, renewable scholarship to a qualified business major entering as a full-time freshman. Requirements include a 3.0 high school GPA and a score of 24 or better on the ACT (or a 1680 or better on the SAT). On-campus interviews will be scheduled after a preliminary review of qualified applications. Application deadline of February 1.

REFERRAL SCHOLARSHIPS

UCC Pastor's Scholarship Awards \$1,500 per year upon recommendation of UCC pastor; limited to members of United Church of Christ (UCC) Congregations. Open to new, full-time freshmen or transfer students. Renewable. Application deadline of February 1.

Lakeland College Referral Scholarship Awards \$500 per year upon recommendation of current student or alumni of the college. Non-renewable. Open to new, full-time freshmen or transfer students. Freshman referral form deadline of February 1. Transfer student referral form deadline of June 1 for fall entry and December 1 for spring entry.

PARTICIPATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Lakeland Dance Scholarship Awards \$500 per year to qualified Lakeland Dance Team participants. Open to new, full-time freshmen or transfer students. Audition or video submission required. Renewable. Application deadline of February 1.

Lakeland Debate Team Scholarship Awards \$1,000 per year to qualified Lakeland Debate Team participants. Open to new, full-time freshmen or transfer students. Audition or video submission required. Renewable. Application deadline of February 1.

Honors Program Scholarship Awards \$1,000 upon acceptance to Honors Program. Open to new, full-time freshmen. Renewable with continued Honors Program participation.

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

András Viski Piano Scholarship Awards \$2,000 per year to an accomplished piano student who serves as accompanist to choral students. Audition required for initial award. Renewable upon audition each year. Application deadline of February 1.

Helen Boatwright Music Scholarship Awards \$500 - \$3,000 per year to qualified music students. Annual audition required, along with participation in a band or choral group at Lakeland. Open to new, full-time freshmen or transfer students. Renewable. Application deadline of February 1.

LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

Kenneth Ertman Memorial Book Scholarship Awards \$300 to a freshman or transfer student who is a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America with the rank of Eagle Scout and who holds current membership in the Order of the Arrow, the National Camping Honor Society of Boy Scouts of America. Renewable. Application deadline of February 1.

Lakeland College Leadership Scholarships Top awards of \$5,000 and \$3,000, and multiple awards ranging from \$500-\$1,000. Open to new, full-time freshmen demonstrating leadership and/or altruism. Supplemental materials and interview required. Renewable. Application deadline of February 1.

Qualifying leadership criteria may include any of the following:

- Boy Scout Eagle Scout Award, Girl Scout Gold Award, WI 4-H Key Award, Boys & Girls Club Youth of the Year or a candidate of these rankings or strong leadership roles within these organizations.
- Leadership roles within a school-based club or organization. (EX: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Editor, etc. of FBLA, FFA, VICA, Student Government, Drama, Yearbook etc.)
- Peer Leader. (Ex: Help a student adjust to a new school, Big Brothers, Big Sisters, in school programs etc.)
- Leadership role in a church organization or other non-profit organization that demonstrates dedication and altruism.

Lakeland academic or specialty scholarships may not apply to students who have tuition and fees funded at 100% from outside agencies.
