Tuition & Fees

Fall term starts on Monday, August 29, 2016 Spring term starts on Tuesday, January 17, 2017



The cost estimates below are meant to serve as guidelines and **are subject to change.** In order to obtain a student visa, you must prove that you will be supported fully for your entire course of study.

Tuition & Fees \$26,560 per academic year (\$13,280 per academic term)

An undergraduate international student must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits hours each term (fall and spring) to maintain his/her visa status. Summer term is optional; however, additional expenses for tuition, fees, room and board and books will result if you take May or summer classes. Most of our courses are 3-credit hour courses; therefore, 12 credits equates to 4 courses. You may take up to 18 credits each fall or spring term without additional tuition costs. Program specific lab fees or fees for professional certification courses are an additional

cost and not estimated in the below expenses.

Commitment Deposit \$100 (one-time fee for new international students only)

Housing Deposit \$200

Room and Meals (on campus) \$8,250 per academic year (double occupancy room in halls with 150 meals per term)

You may select 100, 150 or 200 meals per term. Plans with more meals cost more.

Books \$1,000 (estimated)

Health Insurance \$1,500 (estimated for 12 months)

Miscellaneous Personal Expenses \$2,200 (estimated for an academic year,

fall and spring terms only, and does not

include international travel)*

Total for a SEVIS I-20 \$39,810 (estimated for 12 months)

*Please note if you choose to study in the May term or summer and live on-campus, you will have additional tuition, fees, and room and board costs. You could anticipate an additional \$3,000 to \$4,000 in expenses.

Employment On and off campus employment opportunities, such as internships, and optional practical training under the BCIS and/or Lakeland College rules and regulations are available. Please be aware that there are many restrictions on international student employment in the U.S.

Deadlines All international applications are processed on a rolling basis and there is no deadline. Your application for admission and supporting credentials should be submitted as early as possible to allow sufficient time to process your application, obtain your visa and arrange for transportation. Tuition, fees, room and board charges for the semester are due in full on the first day of each semester.
