## Finding Journal/Magazine Articles

#### To access the library databases:

- Check your syllabus or Library Resources section of Blackboard for the username & password.
- Go to the [library web page](#). (www.lakeland.edu/library)
- Click *Databases Find Articles*.
- Select the database you wish to search.
- Enter the user name and password.

#### To access complete articles:

Hundreds of psychology and education-related journals are indexed in these databases. For many of the journals indexed, you will be able to access the entire article. For others, you will retrieve a citation and brief summary of the article. Articles not available in full-text (complete articles available) may be requested through inter-library loan.

Databases commonly include a feature to allow you to limit your results to full text. Watch for these options:

Limiting your search to full-text may eliminate great articles that could be obtained easily through inter-library loan or another database.

## Inter-library Loan

You found the perfect article, but it is not available online? Don't despair! Give the library's interlibrary loan services a try. Fill out the [interlibrary loan request form](#). ([http://lakeland.edu/academics/library/ILL\\_request.asp](http://lakeland.edu/academics/library/ILL_request.asp))

We will request the article from another library. Available articles typically arrive within 3 business days with some more difficult to locate items taking two weeks.

## How Can I Find This Article?

Have you found a citation for an article in your textbook or elsewhere that you would like to locate? Give our [E Journal List A-Z](#) a try.

Enter the name of the journal in which the cited article appeared. **E Journal List A-Z** will identify if the article is available online and provide a link to that database. . For articles with no online availability, **E Journal List** will indicate if a print copy of the magazines/journals is available in the library.

# Online Library Resources for Counseling

## Online Books

Lakeland's online library contains a wealth of online books covering a wide variety of topics. Go to the library website; click on Databases *Find Articles*. Select *eBook Collection*. Log in. (username and password are available on Blackboard) Click on [eBook Collection](#).

Enter your search terms in the search box and click *Search*. All items in your results list will include two options for viewing the book. The *eBook FullText* option allows the reader to read the book or sections of the book online.

If you want to download the book to read offline on a mobile device, use the *Download* (offline) option. You will need Adobe Digital Edition (free) and an EBSCO account (free). Detailed directions can be found in the *Find Books* section of *Library Resources* on Blackboard.

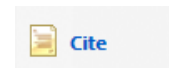

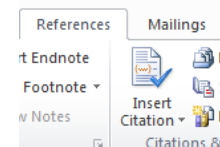

**Citing an article from a library database?** Many of the library databases will provide an APA citation for you. Be sure to check them over carefully. Sometimes they have errors especially with capitalization. Look for a cite icon similar to this
